Title: Signpost Sunday: Disciples, who make disciples

Passage: Matt 9:9, Matt 28:16-20

Disciples: Matt 9v9

So starts Matthews journey becoming a *Christ centred, Spirit filled believer, in active obedience to the Christ.* He was part of the new community (Acts 2) devoted to fellowship, the study of the Word, and prayer. This journey could be represented by a 'Wheel of discipleship".

- · Hub: Jesus as the centre of your life, setting the direction, giving power.
- · Spokes: Prayer, the Word, fellowship and Witness.
- · Rim: A life of active obedience to Christ, is visible to the world.

A disciple is someone who considers themselves a student / apprentice / practitioner of Christ and are resolved to be obedient to His teaching.

Who make disciples: Matt 28v16-20

The Discipleship sandwich – Jesus supplies the bread of assurance v18 and promise v20, but we supply the sandwich filling. We help form Christ in others. W humbly pass on to others, and call others to imitate us, as we imitate Christ (1Cor11v1, 2Tim2v2). John Calvin removed the pews and ran services in heart languages to make disciples. Disciple Makers don't expect new-borns to be able to feed themselves (Grown adults still need help in the kitchen!).
